


FINDING FRIENDS FOR JESUS

MAKE A MISSION BANK

Make simple mission banks for the children to take home. Use single-serve milk cartons or other small cartons about 2 3/4 inches (7 centimeters) square. (For milk cartons that are taller and narrower, make a pattern based on the one below to fit your needs.)

Wash cartons thoroughly to remove any food residue. With a sharp knife, cut two parallel slits about one inch long and 1/8 inch apart into the top of the milk carton, near the peak.





Copy the pattern below (designed to fit a milk carton that is 2 3/4 inches square and 2 inches high) onto white paper. (You need two pieces for each bank.) Let the children color the two sections that will make up each church. If you wish, glue a piece of aluminum foil or gold-tone foil onto the dome, and cut it to fit.

Cut out the church along the solid lines, including the area that protrudes into the roof. Lay the two

pieces side by side, with the flap (A) underneath the wall of the second piece. Tape or glue the two pieces together. Fold along the lower horizontal lines to form the base of the church, and turn the flap inward. Cut the vertical solid lines marked B and C up to the point where they intersect with the fold line. Fold along dotted lines to form corners in the walls and the roof.

Wrap the two pieces of paper around the milk carton so that the dome covers the peak of the carton and the bottom of the carton rests on the dotted fold line. Tape or glue the two end pieces together, with the second flap under the wall of the church. Fold the cut pieces in, and tape or glue them to the bottom of the carton.

Bring the two roof sections together and pinch at the top. Tape or glue them together. With your finger, find the slot that was cut into the top of the milk carton. Gently cut the paper covering the slit to allow for money to pass through.
