He is responsible for the agendas and minutes for a variety of committees and boards, including the General Conference Executive Committee. He coordinates updates and revisions to the Church Manual, General Conference Working Policy, and the General Conference Constitution and Bylaws. He also manages the budget for Secretariat, supports the Associate Secretaries in their work and serves on the Oversight Committee for the Middle East and North Africa Union Mission. He continues his involvement with mission as the co-director of IPRS (the missionary support center) and the special liaison between Secretariat and the Northern Asia-Pacific Division and the Institute of World Mission.
